Who we are

Sabatia Eye Hospital is an independent, not for profit community hospital established in 1996. The hospital serves as a beacon of hope for many poor and underserved Kenyans by addressing the dire need for eye care services through collaboration with local communities and partner organizations/well-wishers.

As the sole tertiary eye care center in rural Western Kenya, it reaches an estimated 15 million people across 17 counties. The hospital provides both outpatient and inpatient services and extends its impact through innovative outreach campaigns into neighboring countries including South Sudan and Uganda. Moreover, through strategic partnerships with local universities, Sabatia Eye Hospital trains the next generation of eye care professionals. Committed to accessible, affordable, and sustainable healthcare, the hospital relies on donor support to continue its vital work.

Governance and Management Structure

The hospital is registered as a company limited by guarantee and operates under the over- sight of a board of directors. The board comprises 9 members representing various stake- holders and partners, including the local community, Friends Church-Vokoli Yearly Meeting, Lions Clubs, and Government of Kenya representatives from the Ministries of Health and County Administration.

The Board plays a crucial role in guiding the management on key governance, administration and financial matters aligned with the hospital's strategic plan.

The Hospital Management Committee (HMC) comprises professional staff responsible for managing and overseeing all hospital activities. Led by the Chief Executive Officer, the committee includes heads of finance, administration, and clinical departments.

Staff establishment includes two general ophthalmologists, two specialized visiting consultant ophthalmologists, six cataract surgeons, fifteen nurses, and administrative personnel working collaboratively to achieve the hospital's objectives. On average, the hospital attends to approximately 40,000 patients annually across its three units and outreach program.

Key Clinical Departments

The organization of the hospital's clinical department is structured as follows:



OUTPATIENT

The clinic operates in five rooms, each equipped with two working areas to support two doctors, offering outpatient services, diagnoses, and management and treatment of various eye conditions.



OPTICAL

The optical section provides extensive refraction services, including prescribing glasses or contact lenses, recommending refractive surgery, and offering expertise in lens designs, fitting, adjustment, repair, and maintenance of glasses.



INPATIENT

With a capacity of 69 beds, the department attends to all the surgical and other medical needs that cannot be addressed at the outpatient department.



THEATRE

Equipped with modern surgical equipment, the theater handles diverse eye surgical procedures, supporting the increasing demand for interventions such as vitreoretinal services and pediatric ophthalmology.



LOW VISION

Offer services to clients with irreversible poor vision, this department manages the low vision cluster grant in collaboration with other eye hospitals.

Paediatric Ophthalmology Centre

Sabatia Eye Hospital's Pediatric Ophthalmology Center (POC) prioritizes children's eye health, aiming to enhance their competitiveness by restoring sight. In 2023, 669 children underwent surgery, up from 504 in 2022. Cataracts, a major cause of childhood blindness, accounted for 32.7% of surgeries. The POC provides child-friendly environments and state-of-the-art services.





Our Satellite Clinics

KISUMU CLINIC: Opened in December 2018, the Kisumu clinic offers comprehensive eye care services, including minor day surgical cases, to address the urban market and reduce patient costs associated with distance.

ELDORET CLINIC: Established in April 2021, the Eldoret clinic replicates the success of the Kisumu clinic, providing comprehensive eye care services to the North Rift region and reducing patient costs associated with distance.

Training Programs

Sabatia Eye Hospital is committed to enhancing the capacity of eye care workers through various training programs. These include the Ophthalmic Skills Upgrading Course (OSUC), designed to address gaps in eyecare services, particularly remote and marginalized areas. Additionally, the hospital offers a B.Sc. In Comprehensive Ophthalmology and Cataract Surgery in collaboration with Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture Technology, aiming produce skilled ophthalmic clinical officers capable of delivering comprehensive eye care services. Furthermore. Sabatia Eye Hospital's partnership with the University of Nairobi plays a pivotal role in capacity development in ophthalmology across Africa. Over the years, the hospital has trained more than thirty registrars, many of whom have become prominent ophthalmologists in the country, contributing significantly eye care service delivery. These training programs are essential in ensuring a competent workforce and improving access to quality eye care, ultimately benefiting communities in need.

Current Challenges

- Limited access and awareness by the local community hinder essential treatments like cataract surgery and diabetic retinopathy care.
- Reduced donor support amid global economic strains necessitates innovative financial sustainability strategies.
- Hospital's limited capacity to hire and pay optimal number of general and sub specialist Ophthalmologists who require additional motivation to work in the rural set up complicates recruitment and retention efforts for uninterrupted service delivery.
- Insufficient transport available for patients and staff commuting to and from outreach centers.
- The ambulance service lacks well-equipped resources to effectively address emergency patient needs.

Despite hurdles, the hospital aims to become a premier teaching referral center, expand into underserved regions, and collaborate on eye research. Sabatia Eye Hospital remains committed to shaping a future where superior eye care is accessible to all.

Fundraising Goals

Sabatia Eye Hospital's fundraising goals are aimed at addressing the pressing needs and challenges of providing quality eye care services to underserved communities. Our target amount to be raised is **KES 150 million (\$1.2 million),** which will be allocated to various projects and initiatives crucial for the hospital's sustainable growth and impact.

- Firstly, a significant portion of the funds will be allocated to infrastructure development and medical equipment to accommodate the growing demand for eye care services, as follows:
- KES 10 million: Towards renovation and furnishing of private wards.
- **KES 30 million:** for the replacement and upgrading of key hospital equipment. This includes investing in advanced technology to enhance the precision and effectiveness of eye surgeries and treatments.
- KES 7.5 million: Towards Facility Facelift of old buildings, amenities, and infrastructure. Most of the hospital buildings are close to 30 years old.
- **KES 10 million:** Modernization of the Hospital Kitchen.

The hospital is also looking for funds to support its patient care programs, including:

- KES 36 million towards outreach campaigns and community education initiatives aimed at raising awareness about the importance of eye health and promoting preventive measures against common eye conditions—24 camps at KES 1.5 million
- KES 10 million towards the purchase and equipping of hospital ambulances
- KES 12 million towards the purchase and equipping of an outreach bus for ferrying patients and staff to and from outreach centers
- KES 30 million towards three additional branches in selected underserved regions, @ KES 10 million per branch

Lastly, a portion of the funds will support research initiatives and collaborations with esteemed institutions to advance knowledge and innovation in the field of eye care, ultimately improving treatment outcomes and patient care.
